About the Workshop

Migration and Diaspora play a significant role in shaping the development processes both at home and host countries in social, cultural, economic, political and literary changes across the globe. There is a constantly growing interest in migration and diasporas among the researchers from Humanities and Social Sciences, policymakers, governments, politicians, trade-business oriented groups, etc. Consequently, this growing interest led to an increase in research in the area of Migration and Diaspora Studies. Migration and diaspora studies always posed various methodological challenges to young researchers who are mostly emerging from the dominant streams of knowledge such as Humanities and Social Sciences. Since this area of study is interdisciplinary and multidisciplinary it is pertinent to address the challenges emerging while researching these areas.

Hence, Centre for Diaspora Studies (CDS) in Collaboration with Centre for Migration, Refugees and Belonging (CMRB), University of East London, U.K. is organizing this unique workshop to train young scientists, researchers, and early faculty members in this area of migration and diaspora studies. It also highlights what are the emerging issues, challenges, and opportunities in this field especially in times like COVID-19. Keeping the ongoing crisis of COVID-19 and physical distancing in mind as safety measures – the workshop is organized *online* through available platforms.

The objective of the workshop is to engage and continue the teaching and learning process during the time of the COVID-19 Crisis. It aims to initiate scholars and young researchers from various disciplines who are interested in researching the issues of migrants, migration, and diaspora. The outcome of the workshop would be enhancing their research capabilities, create awareness about the new approaches, research methods, opportunities, and challenges in the discipline. The subject needs to be approached from an interdisciplinary, multidisciplinary, and transdisciplinary framework that requires to be reframed for the scholars trained in particular disciplines. Thus, there is a need to reorient, retrain, reskill, and update the researchers in novel approaches, perspectives, and methods of research emerging

in the dynamic discipline of migration and diaspora studies. The Centre also plans to publish the lectures by experts and faculty of the Centre into an edited volume on the theme.

Applications are invited from research students, young scientists, faculty members, independent scholars who are working in this area to apply for this workshop.
