Course Title: MODERN CHINESE LITERATURE - I

Credit: 5

Course Type: Core

Pre-requisites for the Course: Knowledge of advanced level of Writing and Communicative Chinese.

Course Description: The course Modern Chinese Literature is a core course which is divided into two parts, Modern Chinese Literature- I (CHI401) and Modern Chinese Literature- II (CHI451), which need to be studied across first and second semester respectively of the M.A. in Chinese programme. The period of Modern literature in China is considered from 1917 CE to 1949 CE, but the reforms in literary circles had started even before from the beginning of the 20th Century. The present course focuses on the study of representative trends, genres and writers/poets of modern Chinese literature from 1900 to 1927.

Course Objectives: This course fulfils the objective of providing disciplinary training for students of M.A. Chinese. The Course aims to Introduce students to important authors, works, and movements in 20th century Chinese literature in the period from 1900 to 1927, as they relate to larger themes in modern Chinese language and culture; It further provides students with the disciplinary vocabulary and knowledge to engage in rigorous reading, discussion, reflection and writing on Chinese literature that reflects training in the field of Chinese literary and cultural studies.

Course Title: THEORY AND PRACTICE OF TRANSLATION - I

Credit: 5

Course Type: Core

Pre-requites for the course: Preferably, students should have completed graduation in Chinese language, should have advanced Chinese language skills with a knowledge of around 2500 Chinese characters.

Course Objective: As a core course, this course is divided into two parts CHI402 Theory and Practice of Translation – I and CHI452 Theory and Practice of Translation – II taught in the first and second semester of the M.A. Chinese programme respectively. In order to enable students make informed decisions while doing translation, course CHI402 Theory and Practice of Translation – I aims to impart advanced methods and techniques of translation, to equip students with translation skills in the language combination of English and Chinese, to make them aware of the translation tradition in the West and China, to expose them to various translation theories among others.

Course Description: The course Modern Chinese Writer- I is an optional course which is the first part of two course series on Modern Chinese Writers to be studied in the first and second semester of M.A. Chinese programme. It covers the period of Modern literature in China, i.e. from 1917 CE to 1949 CE. The present course focuses on the study of literary styles, genres, writings of representative modern Chinese writers whose focus was primarily Novel, Short Stories and Prose Writings, such as Luxun, Zhou Zuoren, Bajin, Maodun etc.

Course Objectives: To learn and understand the writings of popular modern Chinese novelist and prose writers of the period between 1917 CE to 1949 CE. To develop the critical thinking amongst the students in issues related to Chinese literature and Chinese society at large.

The period of Modern literature in China is believed to be from 1917 CE to 1949 CE, but the reforms in literary circles had started from the beginning of the 20th Century. In continuation of the earlier course, present course focuses on the study of representative trends, genres and writers/poets of modern Chinese literature in general and prose/fiction/poetry/drama from 1928 to 1949.

Course Objectives: This course fulfils the objective of providing disciplinary training for students of M.A. Chinese. The Course aims to Introduce students to important authors, works, and movements in 20th century Chinese literature in the period 1928 to 1949, as they relate to larger themes in modern Chinese language and culture; It further provides students with the disciplinary vocabulary and knowledge to engage in rigorous reading, discussion, reflection and writing on Chinese literature that reflects training in the field of Chinese literary and cultural studies.
