Unit-I Introduction to Chinese Phonetics

Organs of speech; Chinese phonetic alphabet; Mandarin Chinese Pinyin (speech sound) chart; Spelling rules; Initials and Finals; Retroflex finals; Four tones and neutral tone; Tone changing; Basic conversations. Listening of audio and reproduction of sounds and words; Substitution drills. Sentences formation with new words. Study of texts and reproduce with own condition such as self-introduction and family introduction. Introduction to numbers. Learn 150 new words and their usage in spoken Chinese from ECR-I.

Unit-II Listening and Speaking Basic Chinese

Listening practices of new words and text; Sound recognition; Tone variations; Speaking of disyllabic and trisyllabic words with tone variation; Reading aloud the syllables, words and sentences from the textbook; Chinese character recognition while reading texts without Pinyin; Tone recognition while reading text without Pinyin and tone mark; Syllable and tone recognition while listening audio/sound; Listening and reproducing similar sentences.

Introduction of daily life; School/university and hostel life theme-based conversation; Numeration (1); Time unit; Monetary unit. Sentences formation with new words. Learn 200 new words and their usage in spoken Chinese from ECR-I.

Unit-III Grammar based Sentences and Dialogue Formation

Listening practices of new words, substitution drills and lessons from audio of the textbook; Reading aloud the words, sentences, substitution drills and dialogues from texts; Numeration (2); Grammar pattern-based sentence formation; Situation based conversation- meeting with friend,

consulting doctor, helping each other; Retelling of text's conversations. Learn 350 new words and their usage in spoken Chinese from ECR-II.

Unit-IV Retelling of text and story

Course Title: INTRODUCTION TO TRANSLATION-I

Credit: 5

Course Type: Discipline Specific Core

Pre-requites for the course: Preferably, students should have advanced intermediate level proficiency in Chinese language, knowledge of around 2000 Chinese characters, and ability to form complex compound sentences in Chinese and English language.

Course Objective: As a Discipline Specific Core (DSC), this course is divided into two parts CHR303 INTRODUCTION TO TRANSLATION-I and CHR353 INTRODUCTION TO TRANSLATION-II taught in fifth and sixth semesters respectively. CHR303 aims to impart intermediate to advanced intermediate level translation skills to students. It seeks to enable students understand the nature, scope, principles and techniques of translation in the language combination of Chinese and English. It aims at making students understand, appreciate and utilize the similarities and differences between the Chinese and English language from the perspective of translation. Finally, the course seeks to enhance students' knowledge about translation as a specialized activity, by primarily imparting various translation techniques commonly used during translation.

On completion of the course, the students will be able to:					
Unit-I	LO1	understand the significance of bilingual competence required for carrying out effective translation. Appreciate the significance of lexical and grammatical comparison between the source and target languages to effectively translate between them. Understand the nature and scope of translation, as well as the difference between literal and free translation.

Unit-IV	LO4	understand the translation techniques of passive and active voices, and affirmative and negative forms. The translation techniques of various clauses such as nominal, attributive, adverbial.

- Omission in English-Chinese Translation by omitting pronouns, articles, preposition, conjunction, verb, impersonal pronoun 'it'.
- Omission in Chinese-English Translation by omitting redundant words, and meticulous description.

Unit III: Translation Techniques: Conversion, Restructuring

- Conversion in of various parts of speeches and sentence elements in English-Chinese and Chinese-English Translation.
- Restructuring of customary word arrangements, customary sentence arrangement and various clauses in English-Chinese and Chinese-English Translation.

Unit IV: Translation of Active-Passive Voice, Affirmative-Negative and Various Clauses

- Translation of Passive Voice in English-Chinese Translation by converting English passive voice in active voice, converting passive structure into a sentence without a subject, by retaining passive structure or replacing it with other Chinese structures.
- Translation of Passive Voice in Chinese- English Translation by converting Chinese active voice into passive and through idiomatic expressions.
- Types of negation and affirmation in English and Chinese, and their varied translations.
- Translation of nominal clauses, attributive clauses, adverbial clauses among others.

Unit V: Translation of long sentences and various documents and texts

• Stages and steps in translating long sentences: Comprehension and Presentation.

- Methods of translating long English sentences: embedding, cutting, reversing, splitting, inserting, recasting.
- Translation of different types of documents: contracts, agreements, proposals, reports, reviews, patents, trademarks, abstracts, indexes, bibliographies etc.

Course Description: The course Modern Chinese Literature is a core course which is divided into two parts, Modern Chinese Literature- I (CHR401) and Modern Chinese Literature- II (CHR451), which need to be studied across VII and VIII semesters respectively of the FYUP (Honours with research) in Chinese programme. The period of Modern literature in China is considered from 1917 CE to 1949 CE, but the reforms in literary circles had started even before from the beginning of the 20th Century. The present course focuses on the study of representative trends, genres and writers/poets of modern Chinese literature from 1900 to 1927.

Course Objectives: This course fulfils the objective of providing disciplinary training for students. The course aims to introduce students to important authors, works, and movements in 20th century Chinese literature in the period from 1900 to 1927, as they relate to larger themes in modern Chinese language and culture; It further provides students with the disciplinary vocabulary and knowledge to engage in rigorous reading, discussion, reflection and writing on Chinese literature that reflects training in the field of Chinese literary and cultural studies.
